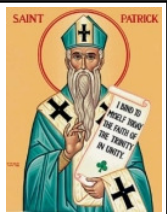

PETITION REQUEST
Same-sex 'Marriage' News from Australian Family Association.

This subject is to be debated in the House of Representative in November.

There is a push to alter the Christian and legal definition of Marriage to include same-sex relationships per a new Marriage Equality Amendment Bill. 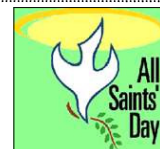


Parish Liturgy Committee Meeting 20 October - Notes

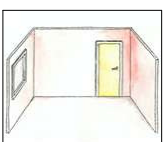
