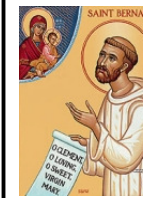

PEACE CHAPEL BROOKLYN There will be NO Holy Saturday or Easter Sunday Mass at the Peace Chapel.

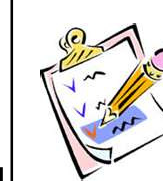

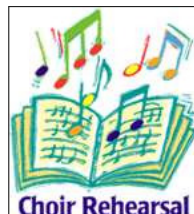


Our young singers Cantors' Workshop has now concluded. A very enthusiastic group of Year 5 and
