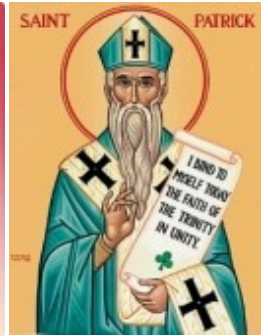
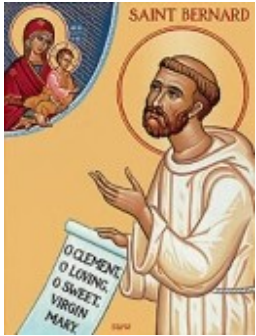

CANONISATION OF BLESSED MARY MACKILLOP

The following information has been forwarded from the Australian Catholic Bishops Conference: The Canonisation of Blessed Mary MacKillop will be seen live both on Australian TV and the Web, direct from St Peter's Square in Rome. Sky TV will broadcast live from about 6.30pm (Eastern Time) on Sunday night, October 17, while ABC News 24, the new 24 hour free-to-air station for the National Broadcaster, has also indicated it will broadcast as much as possible of the Canonisation ceremony. Both will provide expert commentary on the events as they unfold. ABC 1's Compass program will feature a Canonisation special at 10pm. Other stations have indicated they will have features and live crosses to Rome as well as updates in their regular news services.

A live web stream of the ceremony will also be available, complete with commentary. Through the Internet people can access the web stream from the websites listed below.

TV: ABC1 **At 7pm:** ABC News will cross live to the Vatican for the latest coverage on the canonisation celebration. Please note: we do not know if this will be coverage of the Mass only, or will include commentary and other footage.

TV: ABC NEWS 24 **From 6pm:** a two-hour news special broadcast live from the Vatican. Will include live crosses to Rome as well as to reporters around Australia where people will gather to join in the celebrations. These sites include: St Mary's Cathedral, Sydney; Mary MacKillop Chapel, North Sydney; significant sites in Penola, South Australia; the Exhibition Centre, Melbourne; and St Francis Xavier's Cathedral, Adelaide.

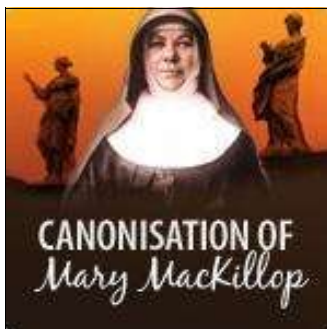

MARY MACKILLOP AN AUSTRALIAN LIKE US

In her many letters, Mary shared her intimate relationship with God and, as she detailed her visits to them in their isolation and deprivation, inspired her Sisters to carry on: 'We can all work quietly doing our best for God' (1883). As her health declined Mary visited when she could, but continued writing her words of support and encouragement – first with her left hand, then by typewriter and by dictation to one of the Sisters.

By 1909 it was obvious that Mary was dying. In January from her sick room, she sent a message to her Sisters: 'Whatever troubles may be before you, accept them cheerfully, remembering Whom you are trying to follow. Do not be afraid. Love one another, bear with one another, and let charity guide you in all your life.' On 8 August, she passed away so peacefully that the Sisters keeping watch were hardly aware of it.

In the ceremony of Canonisation today in Rome, the life and spirituality of our Australian "Saint Mary of the Cross MacKillop" has been officially acclaimed by the Universal Church. Her experiences and her many letters have inspired many to reflect on Mary in published

and electronic format, and in musical and dramatic works. As we remember her final words, "Go on!" we are proud that her spirit is truly alive today, and her work continues

SOCIAL JUSTICE COMMENT

As mentioned last week, **Anti Poverty Week 2010** begins this Sunday and is an annual event during the week coinciding with the U.N's Anti-Poverty Day; its twin aims are to be concerned with poverty around the world, especially in the poorest countries but also in wealthier countries like Australia and secondly to strengthen public understanding of the causes and consequences of poverty and hardship and to encourage research, discussion and action to address these problems. Poverty is a concept used to describe the people in a society who cannot participate in the activities that most people take for granted. While many Australians juggle payments of bills, people living in poverty have to make difficult choices – eg skipping a meal to pay for a child's textbooks. Poverty and severe hardship affect more than a million Australians. At least one in ten Australians are living at or below the poverty line.
